Why was Greener Orkney set up?

Greener Orkney was set up to advance environmental protection and reduce Orkney's carbon footprint and raise awareness of climate change and other environmental matters through practical action and education.

Structure, Governance & Management

The Charity (Greener Orkney (SCIO)) is a Scottish Incorporated Charitable Organisation with its own Constitution. Greener Orkney (SCIO) was first registered on 20 March 2019, consisting of members and the board of Trustees. Members can appoint people to serve on the board and can take decisions on changes to the organisation's constitution itself. Those individuals serving on the board are called the Trustees. The Register of Trustees is kept by the Secretary Anne Sayer.

What was done (outputs)

Through a number of initiatives Greener Orkney helps protect the environment and educate our community on how they can make a difference:

- We run two community fridges to prevent food waste
- We organise regular beach cleans to tackle marine litter. As members of the Scottish Islands Federation, we have researched local marine litter.
- Since May 2025, we have operated a repair café to promote reuse and reduce waste.

Who does Greener Orkney help?

The environment of Orkney benefits from our activities as do several groups:

- Local people are able to obtain food which would otherwise be wasted.
- Local people, visitors and wildlife benefit from a cleaner and safer marine environment.
- Participants in activities comment on the benefits of exercise (beach cleans), increase in knowledge (repair café) and access to food (fridges).

- Local people are able to continue to use otherwise damaged possessions and tools, so saving money by avoiding replacements, but also through reduced materials consumption.

What was achieved? (outcomes)

Since its launch **Repair Cafe Orkney** has held 16 public repair cafes mainly in Stromness and South Ronaldsay and has around 30 volunteers. We have repaired over 120 items brought in by members of the public, saving 400kgs from going into the bin.

In the period March 25 to March 26, the two **community fridges** distributed a total of 26.8 tons (equivalent of five elephants) to ten thousand visitors. This brings the total since the fridges opened to over 100 tons, or a quarter of a million meals.

Over the same period the beach cleaning team carried out 12 events and cleared nearly half a tonne of waste.

What difference was made? (impact)

Teaching skills is a core part of **Repair Cafe Orkney**. Around a third of our visitors get involved in the repair themselves including most recently a young woman who had never picked up a needle and thread. As well as completing her own hand sewing repair, and successfully using a sewing machine, she was delighted to leave the Repair Cafe with some thread and a couple of needles to be able to do some repairs of her own in future.

Distribution of surplus food via the **community fridges** has avoided carbon emissions that would have been generated through transport of waste and through waste incineration.

Through **marine surveys and beach cleans**, attention has continued to be drawn to the international issue of marine litter and in particular the impact of fishing related waste on the marine environment.

How is Greener Orkney run?

Greener Orkney is a volunteer-run organisation. It is overseen by a Chair and a board of Trustees who meet through hybrid meetings.



Recruitment and appointment of the Trustees

Prospective Trustees are recruited from within the community and are interviewed by the Chair plus one other Trustee before joining Greener Orkney (SCIO). They will then stand for election at the next AGM. Any other Trustee or Member of Greener Orkney (SCIO) can stand for election at the same time. The minimum number of trustees is five and the quorum for board meetings is four charity Trustees, present in person or online.

Financial Review

Statement of Financial Position and Financial Review of the Year to 1st March 2026

Greener Orkney (SCIO) holds all assets in the form of cash balances within the current bank account to enable ease of disbursement of funds.

Six grants were received in the year, totalling £29,073.

- £22,192 from the Scottish Government for the Marine project.
- £1,548 from The Pebble Trust and £983 from The Highland Council for the setup of Repair Cafes.
- £1,000 balance of funding from Hubbub for the Refillery setup.
- £3,200 from the Protected Areas Foundation as an 80% upfront grant for the Marine Litter Monitoring project
- £150 from the Highlands and Islands Climate fund for an event during the climate festival.

Donations in the Community Fridges and the Repair Cafes amounted to £3,155 and bank interest totalled £88.

Expenditure was mostly project-related:

- £15,450 for the Marine project.
- £1,411 for the repair café.
- The remaining cost related to day-to-day running the community fridges and refillery.

Non-restricted expenditure totalled £1,057 to cover insurance, memberships, maintaining our website, advertising and AGM costs.

On 1st March 2026 the bank account had a balance of £13,991 of which £9,158 was restricted in use and £4,833 was unrestricted.

Statement of Cash Flows

In the year to 1st March 2026, Greener Orkney had income of £33,412 and outgoings of £27,749. The bank balance increased in the period by £5,663

Brief Statement on the Charity's Policy on Reserves

Greener Orkney (SCIO) reserves policy requires that we maintain at least 12 months of net operating expenses.

Nature and purpose of funds											

Community Fridge – Funding received in order to establish a community fridge, space where surplus food is shared for free, bringing people together to eat, connect, learn new skills and reduce food waste.

Tesco Groundworks - funding received in order to establishment of a website and to promote green recovery issues through new social media platforms.

Foodhub - Funding received to run a 'Food Skills Project'

H&I climate Fund - Funding received to' run a beach clean and a hold a BBQ'

Cycling UK - Funding received to purchase 'bikes and equipment'

MFS Trustees Loan - Loan from Trustees to allow the MFS project to get started.

MFS Project - Funding for 'What is the Orkney Coastlines' Project over financial years 24-25. Deficit is due to pay and claim grant, defect is expected to be cleared by the end of the next financial year.

Repair Cafe - Funding recieved to reduce landfill waste and preserve valuable DIY skills in the community by offering a place to repair everyday items.

Protecting Areas - Funding received for monitoring Orkney's Scapa Flow Marine Special Protection Area to address critical marine litter knowledge gaps.
